









TRIAL PRESENTATION

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Jacob and Susan Davis vs Wilsons and Wilson Farms

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This is a case involving a person who was injured while working with cattle. **Jacob Davis** was in a corral on the **Wilson farm** when he encountered an angry cow, resulting in injuries to his knee and leg. The parties in this case disagree about who is at fault for his injury, this is where we need your opinion.

Your feedback will help us to resolve the case before trial. Please consider all of the information that you are presented, and share your honest feedback based on that information.

Introduction

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Plaintiffs

The plaintiffs, the people bringing this case, are Jacob Davis and his wife, Susan.



The Plaintiffs

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Defendants

The defendants are Jeffrey Wilson Sr, owner/operator of the farm where the injury occurred, and his son Jeffrey Wilson Jr, who also worked on the farm.



The Defendants

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On April 15, 2017, **Jacob and Susan Davis** attended a cookout. A group of people from the cookout planned to help work cattle at the nearby **Wilson** farm the next day.

The parties disagree about the nature of the invitation to help:

The Davis contend that they were invited by the Wilsons, while the Wilsons contend that the Davis only overheard a conversation, and came to help the next day without invitation. The Davis had visited Wilson farms in the past.



Invitation

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On April 16, 2017, Jacob and Susan Davis arrived at Wilson Farms in the morning, and helped to work cattle throughout the day.

The cattle were separated from the herd one at a time, and run through a "squeeze chute" inside a barn, where they were contained while being vaccinated and dehorned.



A squeeze chute similar to the one used on Wilson farms

Morning working cattle

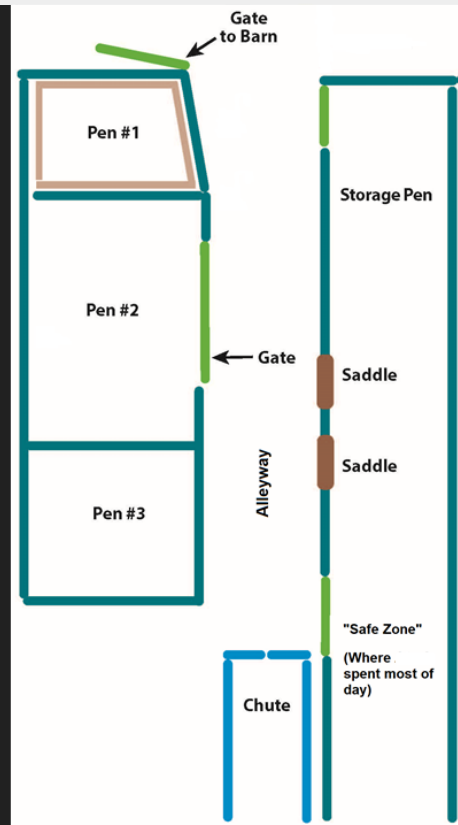
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The Davis helped to work the cattle throughout the day, but did so from within a fenced area in the barn termed the "safe zone" where Jeff Sr. instructed them to stay.

This fenced area allowed them to help with the work, but separated them from the cattle. Mr. Davis administered vaccinations and helped with dehorning, while Mrs. Davis helped to load syringes.



The layout

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At one point during the day, the workers were unable to get a particular cow into the squeeze chute after several attempts, so that cow was placed in a holding pen and saved for last.

After all the other cows had been worked, Mr. Davis left the safe zone (witnesses gave conflicting stories as to why he left the safe zone).



The holding pen

Afternoon working cattle

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After a short break, a new attempt was made to get the last cow into the squeeze chute. When the cow was released from the holding pen, rather than entering the squeeze chute, it turned around and escaped back down the exit alleyway.

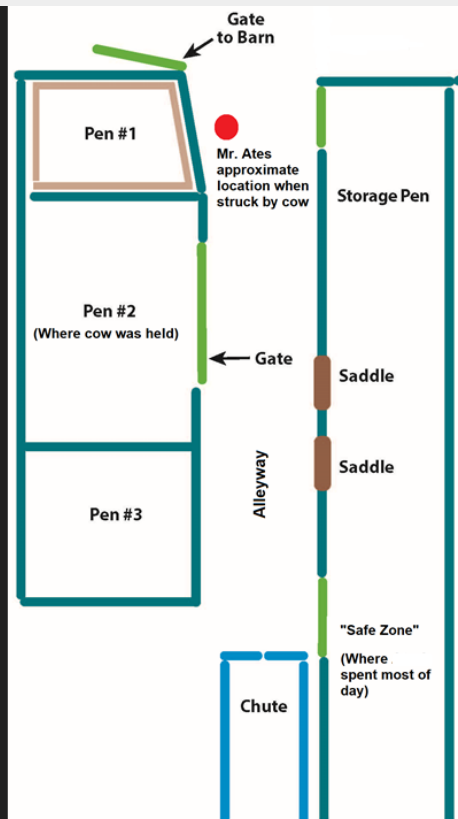
Cow on the run

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Jeff Jr. and another employee were in the alleyway, and jumped up the fence to avoid the escaping cow, but the cow knocked Mr. Davis down and stepped on his knee, causing significant injuries.



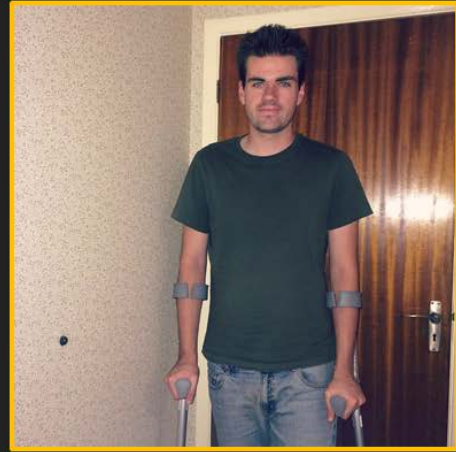
Collision

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As a result of his injuries, Mr. Davis underwent multiple surgeries, spent a year confined to a wheelchair, and 8 months on crutches.

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Witness Testimony

Joe Miller - volunteer cowhand



"After we finished working the main group of cattle, there was a short break and Jacob announced he was going to go to his truck to get something to drink.

After Jacob left the barn, Jeff Sr. instructed Jeff Jr. to let the violent cow out of the holding pen to try and run him through the squeeze chute. Jeff Jr. then opened up the gate to let the cow out. Thereafter, the cow charged towards the squeeze chute but could not fit inside of it. Consequently, the cow turned around and charged the other way down the alley way towards the barn's exit.

As the cow was charging down the alleyway to get out of the barn, Jacob was returning from his truck and entering the barn at the exact same time. Jacob tried to avoid the cow and hop on a side fence, but slipped. The cow stepped on his knee and crushed it."

Witness testimony - Joe Dorsey

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Witness Testimony

Bernie Jones - Wilson employee



"Mr. Davis kept asking to help, he wanted to be a cowboy for a day. So I let him do some vaccinations and maybe dehorning a few times. At all times Mr. Davis remained in the safe zone. During the working of the cattle there was one cow that was pretty wirey and managed to slip through without being worked a couple of times, so we put the cow in a holding pen across from the chute.

At the end of the cattle working there was this one cow left to work. Mr. Davis left the barn to get a bottle of water. The men began working the remaining cow to get it into the chute to work it. The cow made a sudden turn away from the chute and headed for the exit. At that time Jeff Jr. and Joe Dorsey jumped up on the fence. At that time Mr. Davis was entering the barn at the same location the cows had been exiting from the chute all day. The cow hit Mr. Davis and injured his knee/leg."

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Witness Testimony

Jacob Davis - Plaintiff



"I did NOT leave the barn to get water. Jeff Jr. had asked me to help turn the last cow into the squeeze chute, because he and others had failed to get the cow turned on several prior attempts. After Jeff Jr. opened up the holding pen to let the cow out, Jeff Jr. then closed the gate, exposing me and others standing in the alley way when the cow turned around and charged towards us."

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Witness Testimony

Jeff Wilson Jr. - Defendant



"I did not ask Jacob to help get the last cow into the squeeze chute, and I don't know why he was in the alleyway instead of in the safe zone where he was supposed to be.

I did close the holding pen gate after letting the cow out of the holding pen, but I had to close that gate in order to move towards the cow and force it into the squeeze chute."

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Based on these descriptions of the incident, which statement do you agree with more?

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Davis' Argument

- Under Oklahoma law, the Wilsons had a duty to exercise ordinary care in the safety of their invitees. The Wilsons violated this duty in various ways. First, the Wilsons should have never let the violent cow out of the holding pen without ensuring it was safe to do so. Under the Wilson's theory, Jacob was in the alleyway when he should not have been. Assuming that is true, then the Wilsons should have not let the violent cow out until they checked to see that Jacob and other bystanders were out of the way or until at least the cow calmed down.
- Not only was it dangerous to others to let the cow out of the holding pen, Jeff Jr. compounded the danger by shutting the gate to the holding pen after allowing the cow out, thereby removing the gate as a barrier between Jeff Jr, Joe and Jacob, and the cow.



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Davis' Argument



- Joe Miller testified that Jacob was out of the safe zone to get water, and that Jacob did this during the break and announced it to others that he was doing so. Further, he testified that Jeff Jr. was right next to him when Jacob announced he was getting water and that Jacob had no idea the cow was being turned when he was out getting water, and thus no knowledge of the danger that he was about to confront when he was reentering the barn.
- While there are slight variations between Joe, Jacob's and the Wilson's recollections, what is consistent with all of them is that Jeff Jr. let the violent cow out of the holding pen without ensuring that others weren't going to be exposed to the dangerous cow. Further, under both Jacob and Joe's recollection, Jeff Jr. let the cow out of the holding pen knowing that Jacob was going to be exposed to the cow.

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Wilson's Argument

- It is terribly unfortunate that Mr. Davis was hurt, but this incident was only his fault.
- The Davis' showed up that day uninvited, and assumed the inherent risk that comes with working with these large, powerful animals.
- Mr. Wilson specifically instructed Mr. Davis to stay in the safe zone. If Mr. Davis had done so, he would never have encountered the cow.
- The Wilsons had their hands full working cattle, and could not be expected to check that every single person had remained where they were instructed to be before doing any work. This was a dynamic, fast paced operation, and they were dealing with a challenging animal. Mr. Davis should not have put himself in harm's way by leaving the safe zone.
- Mr. Davis may not have been notified exactly when each animal was released, but he had to have known that he was walking in the same alleyway that the cows had exited the barn from all day, and consequently should have been alert for cows and ready to get out of the way.



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Davis' Response

- The Wilsons argue that they never expressly invited the Davis to Wilson Farms and therefore no duty was owed to them. Whether or not the Davis were expressly invited is ultimately irrelevant as Oklahoma and most other states recognize "implied invitation". The Wilsons testified that they never asked the Davis to leave the farm, but instead asked them to help give vaccinations and dehorn the cattle.

It seems to me they exhibited reasonable care by having the DAVIS in the safe area most of the day. It appears he then left the area of his own accord, and apparently came back of his own accord,

with presumable knowledge that they would be reworking that cow after the break. In my opinion the Wilson's would only be partially negligent if their hired hand opened the gate without regard to where other people were.
